

## FROM THE DESK OF TOM REILLY

I recently had the pleasure of speaking at the dedication ceremony for Independence Fire House. As many of you know, the City now recognizes it as a historical landmark. I must say that, beyond its history and status as one of the cornerstones of our city's commitment to public service -- both functionally and symbolically -- the firehouse holds a very special place in my heart. I have been a member of the Department for over 40 years. Even before that, I have fond memories of being at Independence back in the days when my father was the chief. That was in 1972. I think it's fair to say that a lot has changed since 1972, but the ideals that the building stands for have not: volunteerism; tradition; comradery and fraternal spirit; and a commitment to selflessly serving the community. To be certain, we can never repay some of the sacrifices our firefighters have made over the years, but we can and should preserve places that have served as pillars of our community for over a century.

Though I certainly appreciate its historical importance, I also hope that our volunteer fire departments are not relegated merely to a symbolic and quaint vestige of our past. The risk is real. The number of volunteer firefighters has steadily declined over the past few decades, beginning with a significant drop in the 1980s. Correspondingly, the average age of volunteer firefighters continues to increase. Simply put, there are not enough young people filling the ranks of our volunteer fire departments.

The importance of fire departments is of course self-evident. Fire prevention, extinguishment, and rescue is one of the oldest and most fundamental civil services a community can provide. What you may not know is that volunteer fire departments save municipalities (and taxpayers) roughly \$139.8 billion per year in firefighting costs, according to a 2014 report from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). The smallest communities -- such Respectfully as our own -- are almost always served by volunteer departments, according to NFPA. For most places, including South Amboy,



fire department services are provided almost exclusively with free labor.

As participation has decreased, fire and related emergencies have increased - as much as 300% by some estimates. If the trend continues, we will reach a point of no return, and volunteer fire departments may give way to subsidized and expensive services provided either by the State or, even worse, by for-profit private companies.

But I have good news: it is within our power to change this trend. And as I often write in this column, a good deed for the community is a good deed for the self. I cannot promise that public service will cure all ills societal and personal, but I do believe this: providing a much-needed service to your community, and doing so as part of a team, is one of the most fulfilling and satisfying endeavors a person can undertake. Volunteer fire departments in particular are built on fraternal bonds, team spirit, and trust. I have no doubt that any young person who gives their time to our volunteer fire departments will find that it opens doors to new and lifelong friendships, learned expertise, and invaluable opportunities. Your colleagues will love you, your community will appreciate you, and your families, of course, will be very proud. You will be joining a centuries-old tradition, and I think you will experience a great deal of personal growth and enjoyment along the way.




## The Smoke Column

warm weather, it may seem like a weird time to check and clean out your chimney. More than likely, it won't be used again until the fall season arrives with chilly nights so NOW would be the best time to have it serviced and ready when the cooler temperatures arrive. Gas and wood fireplaces are common in most newer homes. According to the Chimney Safety Institute of America, there is an average of 22,000 chimneyrelated fires annually in the United States. If caught in time, a true chimney fire stays in the chimney. There are three chimney fire signs: loud crackling noise coming from the chimney; flames or embers flying out of the chimney top; thick smoke rising from the top of the chimney or leaking back into the fireplace. Even if a chimney fire occurs and doesn't spread to the home, the chimney must be inspected before it is used again. The heat from the fire most likely damaged the chimney structure. Traditional chimney fires are usually the result of ignited creosote deposits that have accumulated in the smoke chamber or chimney flue. These deposits typically form when you burn unseasoned sappy or green wood or by dampening down the flu, which causes the fire to simmer at a lower heat than the fire was designed for. Most chimney fires can be prevented by regularly having a certified professional clean and inspect the entire unit. Chimneys are typically built using masonry or prefabricated metal double-wall chimney stove pipes. Sometimes, a masonry chimney has a metal liner installed inside the pipe. Causes of a chimney fire may be the result of improper burning of products or products that should not be burned in a fireplace because of the

Now that we are still experiencing be escaping from the prefabricated chimney or flue due to the following: age and rust of the flue; improper installation; a clogged chimney and shoddy construction methods used. If sparks do escape from the chimney, they may get trapped between the chimney and the wood framing thus causing the wood framing of the house to catch fire which at that time might be hidden and unable for anyone to see. Attacking and extinguishing chimney fires is not unlike most other fires. However, the difficult part is gaining access to the actual fire. If the fire has expanded to the top of the chimney, the chimney cap or crown must be removed. Inspecting the roofline and interior walls, followed by opening ceilings and walls to check for fire spread, may be necessary. Some of the investigation can be performed by using the thermal imaging camera [TIC]. Having a working fire inside the chimney will cause the masonry to become very hot. Hitting the fire and masonry in the chimney with cold-water from a fire hoseline can cause the masonry to crack and the mortar to deteriorate thus having to replace the entire chimney. A chimney fire can have many challenges as to how far inside the interior of the home must be inspected for fire travel. In one case, shoddy construction left wooden spacer strips inside the interior mortar joints as a way of leveling the masonry. After a week of continuous use of the fireplace, the strips started to slowly smolder under the long-term intense heat in the fireplace. An almost impossible fire to locate as it gave the odor of burning wood and had to be found. The fireplace had to be literally destroyed to find them. Heed the warning to have your fireplace serviced before you use it again. This service should be done yearly if you dangers they cause. Fire, heat, and sparks can have an active fireplace.





## **10 Years Ago** 2015-Cardinal McCarrick/St. Mary's Closes Doors

Little City," when the Diocese of Metuchen announced that Cardinal McCarrick/St. Mary's High School would not reopen in September, after educating literally thousands of students since the school was founded in 1885. Students and parents were totally shocked and heartbroken, and some angry that the school would no longer be open. Those who planned on attending the school in September will be given the opportunity to attend Bishop Ahr HS in Edison, according to the diocese. Diocesan superintendent Ellen Ayoub said in a news release that "It was not just one factor that led to the decision. The accumulated weight of so many issues of Metuchen.

It was a sad day in "The Pleasant indicated that there was no option but to close the school." The school, the oldest in the diocese of Metuchen, was celebrating its 130th year, and once had a peak attendance of 500 students, but only 210 registered for the 2015-16 school year, according to the diocese. The South Amboy school was paid a \$1.8 million subsidy per year by the diocese, which was no longer affordable. St. Mary's opened in September 1885, and taught grades 9-11, and in 1918, 12th grade was added. The school was renamed Cardinal McCarrick High School in 2001 by Bishop Vincent Breen, in honor of Bishop Theodore McCarrick, the first bishop of the Diocese





### Salt Water

Our beach fishing close to home is still in a mid-Summer slump. The times I checked Cliffwood and South Amboy all I saw was a few Sand Sharks and not much else. Fluke fishing in Raritan Bay is still the usual summer pattern-mostly shorts and a few keepers. Surf fishing at Island Beach and LBI are producing some nice Fluke plus a few Bluefish. Party Boats out for Bluefish are doing well with 2 to 6 pound Bluefish and some bigger. Benito and Spanish Mackerel are mixed with Chub Mackerel. Those party boats that fish for Fluke in the ocean are getting some nice keepers plus Ling and Sea Bass. Barnegat Bay features Blackfish and some Weakfish. There are a few Striped Bass around, mostly spotted at night in the inlet. The rocks there are producing some Sheepshead, a few Triggerfish plus many undersize Sea Bass, Spots and Silver Perch are there and off docks in the back bay areas.

## Fresh Water

Summer heat has taken its toll. Most fishing is slow all over. Large Mouth Bass are biting in the early morning and evening hours. Catfish, both Bullhead and Channel Catfish are being caught statewide. If you want Carp, the Delaware River is the place to go. Hybrid Striped Bass are in Lake Hopatcong and Spruce Run Reservoir.




