





devastating wildfires? Unfortunately, that would be an impossibility. New Jersey, along with the entire world, has been sustaining massive wildfires since the beginning of time. Every year we hear of massive wildland fires occurring mostly in the western states where hundreds of thousands of acres may be involved in large open landscapes. New Jersey, being a more condensed state compared to the western states, has many residential structures built within close proximity to the wildlands. Many people like to live in secluded areas with nature surrounding their structure on all sides. How peaceful is it to look out your window and see deer and other wildlife foraging in your backyard? For many people it would be a pleasant experience. Both the state and federal government have literature available to the public on how to prevent wildlands from encroaching on your residential structure, but most people will ignore those warnings. You have heard the saying, "the fire won't happen to me, it will happen to someone else" but remember, YOU are that other guy to someone else. As of this writing in late November, 2024, there are four massive wildland interface fires occurring simultaneously throughout the state. The New Jersey Division of Forest Fire Services has available response personnel and equipment to cover the entire state but to have them all in use at the same time is stressful for everyone. Fighting a wildland fire is much more difficult than fighting a stand-alone structure fire. The topography of the landscape has a great deal of impact on the burning wildland fuels as the fire intensifies and moves much faster up a hill. Humidity also plays a part in the moisture of the material/fuel. With a higher humidity

How do we keep New Jersey safe from level, the material will be less likely to burn. With a low humidity level, the fuel is dry, easy to ignite, and burn as we had witnessed during the entire month of October. There were some days the weather was predicted to be dry with gusty winds causing the fires to intensify and travel quickly throughout the wildlands. Fire responders will need updated weather reports during windy conditions so they know how and where to move personnel and equipment to a safe area and suppress the fire before it reaches residential areas. The wildland firefighters must be well fed and hydrated while working. They require between 5,000 and 6,000 calories each day to keep up their stamina. Some of these firefighters may work from 8 to 12 hours a day before being relieved for rest and rehabilitation. They physically need to be in top shape to move around some of that rough topography. Most of the firefighters that are fighting these fires do so with hand tools such as rakes, shovels, Pulaski tools, and saws. It is difficult to get fire apparatus into these areas because of the topography and the thick growth of trees that makes it impossible to navigate through them. As these fires burn, the ground surface will show flames and smoke which is what is being suppressed. But this is only the top fresh/dry material. Below this surface material could be inches of buried debris that has accumulated over hundreds of years that can also burn and be difficult to locate. The only way to suppress these deep fires is with heavy rain [or snow] for multiple days that will penetrate into these deep seeded grounds. The only advantage of these massive fires is that they produce fertilizer and help generate new growth in the forest but that could take decades to accomplish. When out in the woods, be careful with fire!

From The Times Archives SANTA'S STORY **By Elaine Holton Scott**

hear "Santa Claus," the name of America's old customs with them, including the one favorite Holiday visitor. Historically beloved by children of all ages, what do we really know about this iconic symbol of Christmas? Is he a saint, legend, folklore hero, myth, or all of those things? To find the answers, we have to go back to where Santa's story began, to a place on the southern coast of what is now Turkey. Around 17 hundred years ago in the Greek governed village of Patara, a baby boy, named Nicholas, was born to very wealthy Christian parents. Orphaned at an early age, Nicholas would later give away his entire inheritance to help the poor before he entered the priesthood. Eventually, he became Bishop of Myra, thereupon, donning the red garments and red mitre hat of his elevated rank within the Catholic Church. As was the custom, Nicholas also grew a full beard, one which would whiten with the passing years. Known for his piety and benevolence while alive, it wasn't until after Nicholas died on December 6th, in the year 343, did his fame spread. When more and more miracles were attributed to him, people began calling Nicholas a Saint, "canonizing" him by popular opinion. Through time, Saint Nicholas became Patron Saint of many varied occupations, but will always be best remembered as the Patron and Protector of Children. From an unwavering devotion to "old Saint Nick," a custom started many centuries ago, one which continues to this day, mainly in the Netherlands, Germany, and Central Europe. On the night of December 5th, the eve of his Feast Day, children put their shoes by the front doors of their homes. As the legend goes, Saint Nicholas comes on that night, walking from door to door carrying a big bag filled with little presents. He also carries a list of all children. Good children always find tiny gifts inside their shoes when they awaken the next morning, while the shoes of bad children remain empty. When Dutch and German settlers came here

Say "Saint Nicholas" fast, and you'll to the New World, they had brought their of their beloved St. Nicholas. Proving, "the power of the pen," the "morphing" of the European, religious Saint into a non-secular American Santa Claus would begin in 1821 with the publication of an anonymously written book, "The Children's Friend." In this first lithographed book ever published in America, Saint Nicholas was referred to as "Santeclaus," and said to arrive each year from the North in a sleigh pulled by flying reindeer. The American author, Clement Clarke Moore, expanded on this new identity of Saint Nicholas in his classic poem, "The Night before Christmas, published on Dec. 23, 1823." In it, gone were the Bishop's robes and mitre hat. Gone, too, were his somber countenance and tall, slender figure. Saint Nicholas was now transformed into a jolly, "roly poly" grandfatherly fellow. Dressed in a red suit and fur-trimmed red cap, each year on the night of December 24th, he'd come on a sleigh pulled by reindeer, bringing gifts for all good children. Another chapter in the story of our newly Americanized Santa had begun. As Clement Clarke Moore wrote 192 years ago..."Merry Christmas to all, and to all a good night"!!

Salt Water

The big news is Striped Bass. Party boats are doing a number on these fish. Jigs and poppers are catching most of them. Surf fishermen from Monmouth Beach to LBI are also doing quite well. With the cold weather, Spiny DogFish are moving in giving bait fishermen problems, however, in Raritan Bay it's a different story. I checked local beaches from South Amboy to Keansburg. Some nights only a few people are out and other nights quite a few people are fishing. Everyone I spoke to didn't get any bites, let alone a few fish or two. I saw no one with any fish. Fishing in the bay is very slow, but that should change by the end of the month when Stripers move in, to winter over, with the coming of cold weather. Pete at the Atlantic Bait and Tackle gave me the same info as it's slow all over. Blackfish are being caught at Barnegat Light rocks and on party boats along with Porgies, Seabass and Ling. Fresh Water

Low water is the biggest problem statewide at this time. My wife and I went up to the Pequest River and found that situation in the spots where we usually fish. I did find a spot with some water in it. I hooked and lost a nice Rainbow Trout about 16 inches and missed another one, otherwise we didn't do anything. Winter Trout stocking will take place at Spring Lake. Fishing there may be worth a try. Cold weather and drought conditions will slow up fishing in lakes and rivers.





After school Ann would return to NJ, get married and start her family. After her divorce she met the love of her life, Bill, and relocated to Cary, NC and they were married


in 1994. They enjoyed the water and sunshine at Bill's condo on the coast and she began to take an interest in cooking.


