



In previous articles I warned of the danger and potential consequences of wearing "dirty" turnout gear. Dirty gear is a cancer-causing item and we have been warned over-and-over to clean our gear after every fire we fight, no excuses! Now that the summer season is upon us, we have to be more aware of melanoma and various skin cancers. Do you know how easy it is to prevent skin cancer and how to detect it in its early stages? The fact is, although skin cancer is one of the most commonly diagnosed cancers for firefighters, it is also one of the most preventable. There is a quantifiable risk for firefighters in relation to skin cancer, particularly melanoma which begins with the abnormal growth of skin cells. The three major types of skin cancer are basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma, and melanoma which is the most serious type of skin cancer. Most melanomas occur when the skin is exposed to sunlight and usually appear on the back, legs, arms, and face. Firefighters need to have their skin examined frequently, preferably by a dermatologist who knows what to look for. YOU can look at your skin for unusual moles that could be an indication of early stages of cancer. These moles may have an irregular shape, have notched or scalloped edges, different color variants or an uneven distribution of color, a size larger than 1/4 inch, or moles that become itchy and bleed when scratched. Be aware that melanoma can occur on normal looking skin so don't guess one way or another. We know that wearing dirty gear can cause a variety of cancers inside the body by the off gassing of the smoke/soot that remains in the fabric long after the fire is out. The contaminants if the fabrics are absorbed through the open pores in the skin. Following any exposure to a smoky atmosphere, both inside AND outside a burning structure, remove as much of the harmful contaminants from your skin by using cleansing wipes on your face, hands,

It is a known fact that firefighters are at and especially the neck area. Research has determined that there is greater than a 50% reduction in the contaminants when using these wipes on your skin. You have all heard the saying, "shower within the hour" which means that you should shower as soon as you return from a fire to remove as much of the contamination from your skin as possible. Don't we all wish there were showers installed in ALL the fire stations so we wouldn't have to carry those contaminants home to our families? The New NFPA standards require showers to be installed in all newly constructed fire stations. This may be a good time to pursue funding for those stations without showers. During the warm weather months, firefighters spend a good deal of time outdoors performing apparatus maintenance, training, and fighting fires. Try to position yourself in a shady area, especially during rehab when you are all sweaty and have to remove your gear to cool down. Your pores are open when you sweat which allows contaminants to easily enter your skin. When out in the sun for any reason, apply a liberal coating of sunscreen to your exposed skin to prevent the harmful rays of the sun from causing skin damage. Many fire departments are supplying their firefighters with some type of sunscreen as a preventative measure. Remember that some cancers occur later in life due to an accumulation of sun exposers throughout your lifetime. Examine your skin for the obvious and the not so obvious. Enjoy the sun and the warm weather but do it safely. Note to those sun worshippers, you can still get a tan while wearing sunscreen. Stay safe and healthy out there. 

War Hero Honored At Kennedy Park (Photos/story submitted)





Just in time for Memorial Day, a local hero who lost his life in Operation Freedom's Sentinel during the War in Afghanistan, was honored for his sacrifice. Family and friends of SSG John W. Perry gathered at Kennedy Park on May 27 to dedicate a park bench in his memory. The son of Kathy Fazekas Perry of South River, SSG Perry met Julianne Good of Sayreville, at St. Stanislaus Kostka School where they were both students in the 1990's. They later remet and married, and had two children, Lena Rose and Gavin William. Although Julianne and her children remained in Texas after John's passing, Lena and Gavin visit their grandparents in Sayreville each summer. This particular bench was chosen because of its proximity to the pond, as John and now his children love fishing, and to the skatepark, since he was an avid skateboarder as a teen, and his children now enjoy riding their scooters there.

SSG Perry was killed on November 12, 2016, just days after his 30th birthday. He was on his way out of a gym building at Bagram Air Base when a suicide bomber was on his way into the building to destroy his target, 250 soldiers training for a run. The bomber was startled by John and his Colonel moving toward him, so he detonated early,

immediately killing four men and injuring many others. John was posthumously promoted to staff sergeant and received a Bronze Star and Purple Heart for his heroism. He was later buried at Arlington National Cemetery, and there were memorials held at both Fort Hood and Bagram. He is a true American hero who will never be forgotten.

SSG Perry's mother-in-law, Edna Mazur Pilch, donated the money for the bench plaque, after seeing other benches honoring various residents. The family would like to thank the Borough of Sayreville Parks Department for this opportunity to memorialize their hero. Freedom isn't free.







Fishing Flashes

Salt Water

With Striped Bass fishing slowing up, Bluefish are now taking over in Raritan Bay. I saw a few about 2 pounds caught at Ideal Beach. I did not see too much action at Cliffwood Beach but that could change at any time. It's a different story in the surf at Island Beach and LBI. Striped Bass are still there in good numbers along with Bluefish. Some of these are big, up to 10 pounds. The back areas of Barnegat Bay also have similar fishing. Some Kingfish, an occasional Black Drum and Fluke are present in the surf. Fluke Fishing coast wise is now in its usual summer pattern with plenty of shorts and more than a few keepers especially at Sandy Hook Bay. Blow fish are also showing up in Barnegat Bay. Party boats are doing well with Seabass, but that fishing will close and later on you can only keep one. Party boats then will fish for Bluefish which are moving in along with Ling. Fresh Water

Spring Trout stocking has now ended. I tried the North Branch at Far Hills and Peapack Brook after work in mid-May, catching my limit of 6 Rainbows, plus a small native Brown which I released. I went the following Sunday to the lower Pequest catching 5 in the afternoon with one big Rainbow at 18 inches. In early June, 2 weeks after stocking ended, my wife and I tried fishing there again. She limited out with 4 which is the limit after June 1st. I caught one, it was a nice fish about 15 inches. Bass, pickerel, catfish and various Panfish are now biting statewide.

Remembering Vince Wisniewski



Vince Wisniewski was one of the finest high school baseball players in St. Mary's history. We were sorry to hear that Vince passed away at age 77 in early June 2023 following a courageous battle with ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease.

Born in April, 1946, Vince excelled as both a student and athlete at St. Mary's High School. He was a member of the Eagles varsity basketball team in both his junior and senior years, but it was on the baseball diamond where he shone most brightly. As shortstop on the 1963 state championship team, Vince played a key role in the extra inning rally that led to the Saints' championship game win, singling and eventually scoring in overtime to help the Eagles win the title. And in the following year, 1964, Vince led all Middlesex County high school players in batting with a blistering .459 average. A consistent left-center-field to right-center-field line drive hitter, Vince had a couple of tryouts with major league clubs following high school, but hung up his spikes in order to focus on his family and on his teaching career.

Vince married fellow St. Mary's grad Susan Hansen in 1968, and settled in Sayreville, where Vince and Susan raised their three children, Laurie, Amanda and Matt. After obtaining his degree from Seton Hall University, Vince became a Special Education teacher for Raritan High School in Hazlet for over 40 years. Known as "W" or "Dubs" to students and fellow teachers alike, he was passionate about his teaching, and was awarded Teacher of the Year during his tenure for the care and instruction his students received.

Vince was a dedicated father and family man. Spending his summers painting houses to provide for his family, Vince still always managed to find quality time at home and never missed an opportunity to support his children in their activities. Following his retirement from teaching, Vince enjoyed spending free time hanging out with his family and with lifelong friends, drinking a Stella, telling jokes, and listening to his favorite tunes, whether it was in the backyard, the garage, or at Tommy's Main Paint and Hardware in Sayreville. He also loved telling stories about his table tennis prowess, being a long-time member of the NJ Table Tennis Club in Westfield where he won a number of championships.

Vince is survived by his wife Susan, his daughters Laurie (Anthony) Chiafullo and Amanda (Chris) Richardson; his son, Matthew (Quanlin) Wisniewski; his grandchildren, Rebecca Chiafullo, Grace Chiafullo, Corieanne Richardson, and Jules Wisniewski; his brother David (Holly) Wisniewski; his sister Joan Maxey; his brother-in-law, George Virgilio; his sisters-in-law Nancy (Manny) Maldonado and Kathy (John) Hansen; and many nieces and nephews. He is predeceased by his parents, Vincent and Martha Wisniewski; his sister Claire Virgilio, and his brother-in-law, Tom

Vince Wisniewski was probably the best shortstop in St. Mary's High School history, but more importantly, if you knew him, you knew him as a warm, kind, and friendly man.


