



FROM THE DESK OF TOM REILLY

If I were to ask you to name your heroes, what names would come to mind? With football season in full swing and both New York baseball teams making deep runs into the playoffs, many of you might be tempted to pick a professional athlete. Others might name a celebrity or influencer. Still others might say an author, political figure, or intellectual. Regardless of the selection, our heroes sometimes can feel very far away.

But what if I told you there are heroes here, in our community, worthy of similar, if not greater, respect and admiration? At the far end of the Waterfront Park, near the gazebos, there is an eight-foot statue of Army Sgt. 1st Class Benjamin Sebban. Sergeant Sebban is one of our own. He grew realized that dream, rose quickly through the enlisted ranks, and served in a combat surgical hospital in Germany, among a number of other positions. When he learned that a paratrooper unit was headed to Iraq and needed a volunteer combat medic, he volunteered to go so that others could stay with their families. In March 2007, thousands of miles from home, Sergeant Sebban watched from a position of relative safety when he saw a truck headed for his unit. He ran out to warn the others of a potential attack. The truck was carrying a bomb, and shrapnel from the blast pierced his abdomen. Though his wounds were severe - and ultimately fatal – Sergeant Sebban continued to help the wounded at the expense of his own injuries until he finally collapsed. He later succumbed to his wounds before help could arrive.



of all those who knew him. Speaking at the newly consecrated Gettysburg Battlefield in November 1863, Abraham Lincoln noted that our words never can describe adequately th selflessness, courage, and honor of those who perish defending others, that it is "above ou poor power" to "add or detract" from that sacrifice through words alone. Rather, w up in South Amboy, and planned on making honor their memory by committing ourselve a career in the United States Army. He to the cause for which they gave "the last ful measure of devotion." For Sergeant Sebban then, we honor his memory by committing ourselves to the ideals for which he stood selflessness, devotion to our friends, family and colleagues; courage; and virtuous an noble acts of service and sacrifice, even whe doing so is hard. Ihope you will join me in pondering these ideals, and how we may make them manifes in the world, as Veterans Day approaches. I you have the time, I encourage you to visi Sergeant's Sebban's memorial. Moreover remember that there are veterans in our community who need our help. Some are homeless, some are hungry, many struggle with anxiety and post-traumatic stres disorder. There is perhaps no better way to honor the memory of those who have passed then by helping those in need. I know we are up to the task.

The boys' basketball club finished (17-7), as Makwinski became the school's All-Time leading scorer, easily cracking the 1,000 point barrier. Other big contributors were Wayne Kreiger, who set school records in assists for a year with 137, and career 320, and John Wojcik, who closed out a fine athletic career with 834 points and 241 assists. The Bomberettes as the girls' basketball team was known as back then finished 12-5, and was paced by Nancy Burbank. 

The Smoke Column By Ex-Chief Richard Kosmoski, BA., MS. Part 2. The Future of the Fire Services

NIOSH agenda that we will have to keep an eye on. These changes have been discussed within NIOSH over the past few years. NIOSH has been open to suggestions from any responding agency or organization over the last two years for their considerations on many of these changes. Many fire departments have never heard of NIOSH and the proposed suggestions, the future plans, or completely disregarded what they had heard. Once these NIOSH suggestions become law, we must abide by them or be held accountable if injury or disaster strikes someone on our fire scene. In talking to many fire service leaders, they knew nothing about these NIOSH changes so had no input in making suggestions. Many statewide chief fire service organizations have sent opposition responses to NIOSH which will hopefully be reviewed.

How many local governing bodies are aware of these changes and have expressed their concerns about them? Not many! How would these changes affect the local budgets for the fire departments? If the volunteer fire departments have to make changes and disband for lack of membership, the town would have to hire a career department for protection. The funding of a career fire department would run about the same as funding the police department. Can your local government afford the funding for a career fire department? Where would this funding come from? YOU and your taxes.

Additional changes coming our way may be in our training and credentialing programs. More training is in our future if NIOSH wants to change the various courses necessary to become a firefighter and combine the different functions into one category. The New Jersey Division of Fire Services (DFS) has the overall responsibility of certifications

Many other suggestions are on the and training of the New Jersey firefighters. The Division is constantly updating the required courses and training that each firefighter must take and begins when the person starts the initial training to become a firefighter and throughout his career. Back in the 1960's, it took almost no time in training to become a firefighter. In some volunteer fire departments, you joined, the next day you were on the engine with the senior officer telling you what to do. It was called on-the-job-training. In the 1970's, some of our classes were only 24 hours long. If you want to become a firefighter today, you need a minimum of three hundred hours of training as required by the DFS. Going to fire school at night for three nights a week will take you 7 months to complete. How about those firefighters who have been qualified for many years? There is no such required CEU training, but there is other specialized education that is being introduced that is being made mandatory by the DFS. If this training is not completed, you cannot ride the apparatus.

> As you survey the future of the volunteer fire services, it does not look like they will be able to hold on for many more years. Volunteers are not knocking down our doors to join the fire service. Many must work two or more jobs just to pay the bills. How do we ask that person to give up three nights a week to become a volunteer? What more can the local municipalities do to help out the volunteer firefighters? When have the local governing bodies looked into these situations? Once the volunteer firefighter is gone, the volunteer fire service will be history. 





25 Years Ago "Coyote Ugly" Came To South Amboy By Tom Burkard

years since South Amboy was infiltrated with Hollywood types, actors, producers, directors, etc., while parts of the movie, "Coyote Ugly" was being filmed on the corner of South Broadway and David Street. The building which is on the corner, across from Krauszer's Store, served as the setting for the film's SeaSide Pizza. Producer Jerry Bruckheimer's film featured Jersey girl, Piper Perabo, who emerged as the star of the movie. She portrayed a waitress at the pizzeria, with aspirations to become a superstar singer/ songwriter. She chased her dreams to New York City, despite concerns of her father, who was portrayed by the world-renowned actor John Goodman. Perabo played the role of Violet Sanford, AKA "Jersey," and landed a job at a NYC bar called Coyote Ugly. While working there, the aspiring young woman came out of her shell, and continued to pursue her dream. Initial reports in the City of South Amboy circulated around town, with people actually thinking there was a new pizza parlor on Broadway. Young and old alike said they were looking forward to trying the pizza at the "new business." Throughout the shoot, local curiosity seekers and stargazers cruised along Broadway in hopes of getting a glimpse of movie stars who had invaded "The Pleasant Little City." Actress Tyra Banks portrayed the role of Zoe, and Johnny Knoxville had a bit part as a College Guy. Two local businesses were offered large sums of money by the movie company to use their stores/shops during the shooting. In addition to the South Amboy shooting location, scenes were also done at Sea Bright, NJ, Atlantic Beach, NY, and New York City. The Coyote Ugly days were pretty exciting ones for local residents, probably reminiscent of back in the early '80's, when Woody Allen's "Purple Rose of Cairo" was

It's hard to believe, but it's been 25 shot at the old Raritan Diner on Bordentown Ave, and the cast members and crew used the South Amboy Knights of Columbus Council #426 as their headquarters during the filming. Mia Farrow starred in that movie with Allen. Notebook: "Coyote Ugly" wasn't released until the following year, July 31, 2000, and in the first weekend, box office returns were \$17,319,282, and worldwide to present, the movie has amassed \$113,916,474, overall a big success...Piper Perabo played the role of the singer, but the actual voice on her songs was that of country star LeAnn Rimes, who also appeared in the movie, playing herself. The soundtrack from "Coyote Ugly," with Rimes singing was certified 4 times platinum, selling over 4 million copies....Piper Perabo grew up in Toms River, NJ, and graduated from Toms River North HS in '94....She has had an outstanding career in acting, having appeared in many movies, TV shows, and even some Broadway productions, and has won numerous awards for her acting skills... Jim Kopystecky, who helped his mother, the late Dot Kopystecky run their business, Dot's Luncheonette at the time, shared his thoughts and memories, saying that "What I remember most was how meticulous the workers were in transforming an empty shell of a building into a Pizza Restaurant." He also mentioned that "The movie company rented our parking lot for 1-day, and also the roof of our store to put up a giant spotlight for the filming. Once the filming began, the section was roped off to the public. In the beginning, they wanted to rent our place, but it was too small for their plans. The filming crew and staff was a nice group of people, and for about a month and a half came in and had breakfast and lunch, which really helped business. I recently heard that actress Tyra Banks was talking about doing a sequel to "Coyote Ugly."



Fishing Flashes By Teo "Weebles" Weber **Salt Water** Local beach fishing is still slow-only a few small Bluefish with some Snapper Blues and Spots have been caught at the Perth Amboy Pier. Surf fishing, coast wise, has taken a hit due to Stormy weather. Blackfish are being caught at Barnegat Light rocks. There is quite a variety of mixed species of fish in back bay areas. I gave it a try in mid- September at the 2nd St bulkhead in Beach Haven. I caught numerous small hand size Seabass plus a Silver Perch and a short Fluke. I returned to the same spot a week later only catching more of the same plus a small Blowfish, 2 small Sand Sharks, and 3 Pigfish which are a kind

of the same plus a small Blowfish, 2 small Sand Sharks, and 3 Pigfish which are a kind of Grunt fish usually found to our south. I returned everything-too small to keep. When the surf calms down, Bluefish and some Kingfish should be available. Party boats are still doing well with Bonito, Bluefish and a few False Albacore. Fluke season is closed so party boats are looking for Sea Bass with a 10 fish limit and bringing in Porgies and Ling.

The big news is that due to low water tables in our rivers, the fall Trout stocking has been put off till after the middle of October, if water levels keep dropping it may be pushed further back or even canceled. The Lakes and streams are normal for Fall fishing patterns with Bass, Catfish and Panfish being caught statewide. The Delaware River has lots of Small Mouth Bass but they tend to be small.



The new preschool play area will feature playground equipment suitable for young children, such as low swings, slides, a sandbox, and play sculptures. This project will not only provide a safe environment for children to play, but also provide healthy outdoor activities.

According to the city, the new funding will create a formal play area of approximately 50' x 50'(2,500 sq ft), capable of accommodating up to 33 children at a time, meeting national childcare standards for outdoor play areas. A nearby parking area, which provides easy access for driving parents, will also be repaired and reconfigured to meet safety standards.






