



and dangers associated with Lithium-Ion (LI) batteries and some of the devices that use these batteries and have caused deadly fires. In New York City alone, eighteen people were killed as a result of LI fires in 2023. These batteries can explode and/or erupt in fire at any time whether they are being charged, discharged, in use or not. LI batteries are the way of life today as they power just about everyone of our portable devices such as laptops, phones, watches, scooters, earbuds, hearing aids, smoke & CO detectors, automobiles, and the list goes on with more devices constantly being added. If a battery failure did occur in your home, there is a good chance that you would survive and the amount of damage would depend on the size of the fire and how quickly the situation was managed. In some cases, there may be a warning such as a metallic/plastic odor emanating from the device before it explodes. What would be the consequences if one of these portable devices malfunctions when being transported on an airplane in flight? Fires on airplanes are extremely rare for the number of flights that occur, but when they do occur, they could be disastrous. Historically, fires on planes have previously been the result of a mechanical or electrical problem with the aircraft itself or one of the engines. There is now a new concern for the airline industry and it is one that the airline passenger must assume most of the responsibility. Thermal events on airplanes have been increasing over the past ten years. The cause is portable rechargeable devices powered by Lithium-Ion batteries. These devices have caused over five hundred thermal events on planes since 2006. But bringing a laptop, cell phone, e-cigarette, on a plane is a widespread practice. In previous articles I mentioned the risks increase in LI battery events which more than doubled since the previous year. In 2016, as a response to a growing number of fire events, both Lithium Metal and Lithium-Ion batteries are banned from the cargo areas of passenger planes. This has resulted in a marked decrease in battery fires occurring in cargo areas. Even with smoke detectors and suppression systems installed in cargo areas, it is still difficult to recognize a fire that erupts and even more difficult to suppress the fire. These cargo areas are not readily accessible from the passenger compartment. If a fire occurs in the passenger compartment, it could be recognized quickly and an aggressive attempt could be made to control it. Some airlines are now carrying fire containment bags on their aircraft which are designed to contain fire from a portable handheld device. So far, these bags have worked with good success but they are not yet mandatory throughout the airline industry. The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) published a document implying that with an uncontrolled fire on a plane, the pilot has less than 19 minutes before the cabin becomes untenable. How quickly could a pilot get to and land at an airport in that short amount of time? So, let us go back to the responsibility of each and every passenger on a plane to do their due diligence when traveling. Do not allow your portable rechargeable devices to be checked into the cargo area. Ensure that your devices and batteries are in good working order. If you have difficulty installing the battery in your device or it is feeling excessively warm when charging or has an odor, it may be an indication that the battery is internally defective. Most airline check-in apps have prompts that ask passengers to confirm that they are not carrying LI batteries

in their checked-in baggage. Do your part and everyone will arrive at their destination safely.



Historic Crypt Explored By Jordan Drevelus

buildings in South Amboy lies a crypt with just as much historical wealth as the building which towers above it. Beneath a small hole in the choir of Christ Episcopal Church lies the crypt which was built to house the deceased members of the historically famous Stevens Family. The Stevens family, while known as a family of inventors and boat racers, had a residence in South Amboy called Stevensdale. They built Christ Church, originally named Saint Stephen's Church, as their place of worship. Years before, a tunnel led from Stevensdale into the crypt for easy access to the church. Years later, a church extension was added, and the crypt's entrance was covered by the new altar and choir. This addition left a small hole for access and its use for future casket burials impossible. In the crypt lie members of the Stevens and Conover families including John Cox Stevens and Commodore Thomas A. Conover.

In May, the parish historian Kurt Kvist, representing the vestry of Christ Church, along with parish organist Jordan Drevelus, representing the parish staff and the Rev. Ann Urinoski, the Priest-in-Charge, welcomed the Historical Society of South Amboy to



15 Years Ago In The Times

A Little Bit Of Daylight Bakery History

*My parents were the original owners of the bakery, and I thought I would give your readers a little bit of Daylight Bakery history. I have always been proud of the success my parents achieved building the business from bottom up. It was a very demanding business to run, and they had few vacations in their working years. If a baker did not show up for the night shift, my dad had to step in and work both the day and night shifts. Momworked tirelessly running the shop, but she still found time to be a mother to my 2 sisters, Pat and Judy, and to me. She was a volunteer driver for the Motor Corps during WWII, Vice-President of the PTA, a member of the Women's Club, top notch bowler and on and on. They are a hard act to follow.

Daylight Bakery History

Our family is saddened to learn of the closing of Daylight Bakery. My father and mother, Otto and Edna Doucha were the original owners of the bakery, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 1, 1933. They were both 24 years old at that time and had married only 4 days prior to the grand opening of the bakery. Mom and dad had wanted to own their own business, and an opportunity arose when they were able to purchase used bakery equipment from a bankrupt bakery in Bloomfield. With the help of mom and friends, dad personally set up the ovens, benches, display cases and whatever else was used in the bakery. They opened for business during a severe snowstorm. Needless to say, they had very little business on their grand opening day and sold the goods that would spoil to a local chicken farmer for 50 cents a bag. A loaf of bread sold for 10 cents and a dozen hard rolls were 24 cents. After paying their bills, they had \$20 left to cover their payroll at the end of the week. The rest is history. Their bakery was a success from the beginning. Mom took care of the front end of the business dealing with the customers and finances, and dad was the master bread maker, pastry man and cake decorator. He won the National Grand Yeast Award, taking 1st place in the state for his bread. He also ran cake decorating classes for his employees to insure they met his high standards. It was a partnership that worked for them throughout their 55 years of marriage.

After the explosion in 1950, mom and dad really never closed the store. They supplied food for the rescue workers that evening, and opened for business later the next day. How they managed, I'll never know. Like the rest of the residents of the town, we suffered severe damage to our store and apartment. Dad had his injuries bandaged, and he boarded up where the plate glass windows once were, swept up the debris from fallen ceilings and continued baking for the town. They sold the bakery in 1951, but never forgot the warmth of the people of South Amboy.

My personal favorites were numerous; however, dad made a wonderful sugar cookie that I'm still trying to replicate. His pastries and desserts were influenced by his Austrian heritage, and he took great pride in using the finest ingredients in his baked goods. His cake decorating was always a work of art.

Our mother Edna, resides at Navesink Harbor, now known as the Atrium at Navesink, in Red Bank. She will be celebrating her 100th birthday on Dec. 12, 2009.

Daylight Bakery Memories

Former South Amboy resident Betty Silvaney of Pennsylvania writes, "Sorry to hear Daylight Bakery closed. I was a regular customer in the 50's for their "crumb buns." Loved the Napoleons and éclairs too!

Patricia Fitzmorris Kearney also of Pennsylvania said, "I cannot believe Daylight Bakery is closed. They did have some great treats there! They had the BEST cherry turnovers-half moon shaped with crumbs on top. My mom always loved their Russian coffee cake, and no childhood birthday would have been complete without a birthday cake from there."

Jim Phillips of South Amboy recalled, "As a kid going to the back door of the bakery after hours to buy "day old" rye bread. Mr. Otto Ducha, the owner always gave me a treat. The Ducha Family lived above the bakery. Otto had an elaborate train layout. He sold the bakery after the explosion to Mieso. They moved to Keyport and ran a hardware store there."

Missy Sumski DiMauro formerly of Sayreville and now residing in Myrtle Beach, SC, remembered, "My father Stanley Sumski, started buying my mother's birthday cake at Daylight Bakery when they were dating, and did so every year until 1988,


which was the birthday before we moved to Cape May, and before my father's passing in 1990. They were married in 1958. That's 30 years of cakes! My mother, Carole Joy Kurtz Sumski, is a "Christmas Baby" as her birthday is Dec. 23. Every year, while I was little, and I know for my 3 older brothers as well, my dad would have to "take a ride" on Dec. 23. Dad would get the cake and we kids would get some cut out cookies. Of course, my mother always asked where we got the cookies, as if she didn't know. But she played along as we all enjoyed the sprinkled sugar cookies and devoured the delicious strawberry filled birthday cake that my mother was forever "surprised" at receiving. Those are memories that time cannot take away, and I thank you so much for the opportunity to share ours."

Jim Gray of South Amboy, who lived on lower David St. recalled that, "The baker put donuts by the screen door in the back to cool off, and one day, a couple of us opened the door and grabbed some jelly donuts, and the baker chased us down the railroad tracks, and never caught us. Steve made the best donuts ever. A few years later, I married the baker's daughter, Rose."



Speaker Craig J. Coughlin Joins Food Security Leaders for Feeding NJ Conference

Assembly Speaker Craig J. Coughlin and resources to amplify our impact and make today welcomed attendees to the Feeding NJ Conference, convened by Community FoodBank of New Jersey (CFBNJ), FoodBank of South Jersey, Fulfill, Mercer Street Friends, and Norwescap.

The conference brought 300 participants to Rutgers University from over 100 nonprofits around the state, including food pantries, soup kitchens, and other local food assistance organizations. Experts, advocates, and volunteers attended sessions with topics ranging from fundraising to "farm-to-pantry" partnerships with local farmers. They shared knowledge and discussed strategies for improving services and increasing capacity around the state.

"I am very proud of our record in New Jersey, innovating and leading the nation in the fight against food insecurity, the issue closest to my heart," said Speaker Coughlin (D-Middlesex). "We are blessed with talented, tireless advocates for our neighbors in need. Events like Feeding NJ showcase that talent and give the people on the frontlines the opportunity to coordinate their work and support one another. We have increased investment to scale up these efforts and have seen real results in every corner of the state."

As part of today's event, facilitators discussed expanded programs and new initiatives centered on the experiences of those seeking services.

"New Jersey is a national leader in the creation and implementation of innovative, neighbor-centered approaches to addressing food insecurity, like choice models and a focus on the healthiest options," said Elizabeth McCarthy, President & CEO of the CFBNJ. "I'm proud that, for a second year, Feeding New Jersey has brought together our state's most steadfast advocates, from food banks to local organizations to government leaders. Together, we can pool our knowledge

a lasting difference for our neighbors in need."

State aid for food banks has risen over 400% in the last four years with state support to ensure local farmers and businesses have easier access to make donations as well. The New Jersey Food and Hunger Grant Program has provided funds for local food banks to purchase van fleets to transport excess food from restaurants and grocers that would have otherwise been wasted.

Under Speaker Coughlin's leadership, the state legislature has prioritized increased funding for various efforts to fight food insecurity. Other actions taken by the legislature include:

- Guaranteeing a minimum monthly payment of \$95 to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients, which mostly benefits children, seniors, and veterans. The action was taken after federal funding lapsed.
- Passing a new law sponsored by Speaker Coughlin, which expands student eligibility for free school breakfast and lunch. Starting in September, an additional 60,000 children will have access to nutritious meals at school.
- Established the Food Desert Relief Act program to provide a quarter of a billion dollars in tax credits to attract and support a first or second supermarket in the state's 50 most food insecure communities.

"Every New Jerseyan benefits when our neighbors have access to nutritious food," added Speaker Coughlin. "From better education outcomes for our kids, to lower unemployment numbers for adults, and dignity for seniors, this is about meeting our moral obligation and securing a stronger future for our entire state."

Salt Water

Fluke fishing has turned out to be good. Some keepers have been caught in the surf along the entire state. Party boats have been doing well in the ocean and Raritan Bay. The back bay areas at LBI have been producing keepers with some Weakfish too. The surf at Island Beach and LBI gave up quite a few big Bluefish up to 10 pounds. Bluefish have moved inside Manasquan and Barnegat Inlet giving shore fisherman a thrill. There was a good Black Drum bite at LBI and Island Beach, but the Bluefish even bit off hooked baited with clam and that fishing has ended. Sea Bass fishing is very good on the party boats with many 10 fish limits. Ling and a few Blackfish are mixed in. Striped Bass, some keepers and some over and under the slot limit, are being caught mostly in the ocean. Locally I have checked Cliffwood and Keansburg beaches a few times but did not see anyone catch anything except for one short Striper and a few missed bites. There are quite a few people out trying their luck. Bluefish may slow up any day now.

Fresh Water

Trout Fishing turned out to be good statewide. My wife and I returned to the lower Pequest River in mid-May. I caught 2 on lures and she caught her 6 limit catch on the old reliable worm. One of these was a Rainbow about 18 inches. We returned to the same area on the Memorial Day weekend with me losing 3 and she again caught her limit of 6. We returned to our favorite spot in early June with me losing one. She pulled out 3 Trout and a large eel, yuck! After June 1st the trout limit is 4. Lakes, ponds and rivers statewide offer good warm water fishing for Bass, Pickerel, Catfish and Panfish. The Shad run in the Delaware River is over.




